Kaneko was born in Tosa (currently Kochi Prefecture).




Katsujiro Iwai of Iwai & Co., Ltd. was born into the Kageyama family in Kyoto.

Ooh! So this the artificial silk being mass produced in the West. What shine...




Artificial silk, also known as rayon, was produced using chemistry instead of silkworms.


Domestic cotton production is expensive and inefficient. And there are government taxes imposed on cotton imports to safeguard the industry on top of

However, the cotton trading companies were confronted with the issue of how to procure raw cotton, which was critical for expanding the industry.










































Camphor trees are only found in parts of East Asia. Taiwan was known to have the largest plantations.




At the time camphor was used in insect repellent, medicines, and perfumes. Demand was also increasing for use in explosives and celluloid.





















































































In 1908, Nippon Celluloid and Artificial Silk Co., Ltd. (today's Daicel Corporation) was established in Aboshi, Hyogo.











"In 1908, Nippon Celluloid Artificial Silk Co., Ltd. was established by Mitsubishi, Iwai & Co., and Suzuki & Co. The company was a forerunner in Japan's industrialization process for celluloid products and the chemical industry. Japan Celluloid can be considered the birthplace of Japan's monozukuri."

In honor of its 90th anniversary, Daicel erected a monument at its Aboshi factory. Iwai exported Japan Celluloid's products. Products with the KB mark (Kagaya Bunsuke= Iwai Bunsuke's trade name) were sold around the world as a major export of Japan.
